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On Timely Feedback | Feedback and Feedforward | assessment

- 01 Task-involving feedback keeps attention on the work and the next move.
- 02 Ego-involving feedback can shift attention toward rank, identity, or comparison.
- 03 Useful timing includes enough space for revision or another attempt.
- 04 Feedback should be specific, comprehensible, and tied to criteria.
- 05 A small number of high-value actions makes follow-through more likely.
- 06 The next performance shows whether feedback changed learning.
